


#### Dakshineswar Kali Temple :

#### Nakhoda Masjid :

The Nakhoda Masjid the largest Muslim Masque in West Bengal and eastern India has a long history before 1854, there used to be two different mosques at the present site. Haji Zakariah who was (Kutchi) Cutchi Memon merchant and business tycoon in those days was a regular musallee (devotee). The Cutchi Memon are a Muslim community who came to Calcutta around 1823 onwards.



St. Paul's Cathedral is a Church of North India cathedral of Anglican background in Kolkata, West Bengal, India, noted for its Gothic architecture and dedicated to Paul the Apostle. It is the seat of the Diocese of Calcutta. The cornerstone was laid in 1839, the building was completed in 1847.













# How to Reach



## **By Train**

Kolkata railway station (formerly known as Chitpur railway station) is the newest of the city railway stations and along with Sealdah station, it serves the metropolis Kolkata from the eastern banks of the Ganges River; the others are Howrah Junction, Shalimar station and Santragachi Junction on western banks of the Ganges.

- The distance from Kolkata Railway Station to Biswa Bangla Convention Centre is 12.7 km.
- The distance from Sealdah Station to Biswa Bangla Convention Centre is 13.2 km.
- The distance from Howrah Railway Station to Biswa Bangla Convention Centre is 17.2 km.
- The distance from Shalimar Station to Biswa Bangla Convention Centre is 23.9 km.
- The distance from Santragachi railway station to BBCC is 25.8 km.



### **By Air**

Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose International Airport or Kolkata Airport at Dumdum is among the busiest airports in the country in terms of overall passenger traffic. Spread across an area of 2,460 acres, the airport has all the latest facilities. There are three terminals here: domestic, international and cargo, and flights are available for all the major Indian and international destinations. Airlines such as Air India, IndiGo, Jet Airways and SpiceJet have regular flights to Mumbai, Delhi, Lucknow, Agartala, Bangalore, Patna, Ranchi, Aizawl, Chennai and many more travel through Kolkata. Those travelling to Bangkok, Singapore, Doha, Dubai, Dhaka and Colombo can board fights operated by Emirates, Jet Airways, Singapore Airlines, Thai Airways and Etihad Airways. Upon reaching the airport, travellers can opt for prepaid taxis, app cabs, autos or buses to reach anywhere in the city.




